Like children anticipating Christmas morning, we can barely control our excitement! This month we will finally have the newer, smaller Lyric hearing instruments in our hot little hands!!

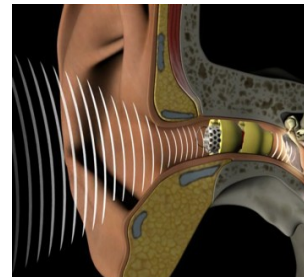
We are scheduled for training during the second week of August. According to the manufacturer, devices will be shipped to our office following that training. As soon as we

have inventory, we will begin contacting those patients who are on the lengthy waiting list.

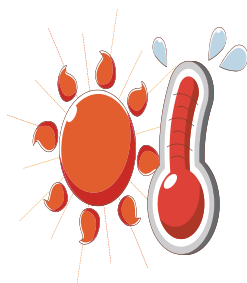

TAP

Amplified telephones are available through the state's Missouri Assistive Technology Telecommunications Access Program (TAP).

To be eligible, you must be a Missouri resident and have telephone service in your home. In addition, you must have a certified disability that prevents you from accessing or effectively using basic telephone services with standard telephone equipment. Finally, your annual ad-

justed income cannot exceed \$60,000 for an individual or an individual plus a second exemption, spouse, or dependent. For each additional dependent claimed, \$5000 can be added to the \$60,000 base level.
